## THE JOURNEY SO FAR

Growing up in Ozubulu, a town in Ekwusigo LGA of Anambra state Nigeria, Mr Patrick Nwabueze witnessed many deaths in his community from diseases that could have been avoided, if only they had money. Some people even lost their lives at the Hospital, waiting for their relatives to pay the deposit that the hospital demanded. He was filled with helplessness and anger at the unfairness of the world. He also had a vision born in him that he was going to see how to end such trend. He vowed to himself that he would find a way to provide free healthcare to the poor in Africa, no matter what it took. This gave birth to Eagle Eye Foundation in the year 2013.

He set up the foundation locally and was pushing for funding to make the vision a reality.

He had a stroke of luck one day. He was offered a chance to go to Germany for a better life. He was ecstatic and thankful for the chance. He got ready and flew to Berlin, with the hope of bringing honor to his family, community and his country.

He soon discovered that life in Germany was very different from life in Nigeria. He was amazed by the advanced technology, the efficient transportation, and the high standard of living. He also noticed that the people in Germany cared a lot about their pets. He saw dogs and cats wearing clothes, eating gourmet food, and visiting veterinarians. He even saw a pet hospital that looked more modern and equipped than any human hospital he had ever seen in Nigeria.

He felt a pang of sadness and anger. How could it be that animals were treated better than humans in some parts of the world? How could it be that millions of people in Africa were dying from lack of basic healthcare, while millions of Euros were spent on pampering pets in Europe? He decided that he had to do something about it.

He became prosperous working there, and some money was put aside that was used to fund Eagle Eye Foundations. The foundation's goal was to give free healthcare to the needy in Africa. He asked his friends and family abroad to join him in the project. He also sought the help of some NGOs and donors who supported his mission.

He began by organizing free medical outreach programs in different parts of Nigeria. He hired some doctors and nurses, bought some medicines and equipment, and rented some vans and tents. He and his team traveled to rural areas and slums, where they set up temporary clinics and treated the people who came. They also educated the people about hygiene, nutrition, and disease prevention. They also went to hospitals to pay for the people who could not afford their bills when they were discharged. They saved many lives and improved many more.

However, He soon realized that his efforts were not enough. He noticed that many people who came for the free medical outreaches had chronic conditions that required regular treatment and follow-up. He decided to enter into an agreement with some hospitals in Nigeria. He offered to pay for the medical bills of the poor people who came to the hospitals, as long as they met certain criteria. He also decided to register the people who qualified for his scheme as members of his foundation. He gave them membership cards that they could use as identification when they went to the hospitals. He instructed the hospitals to treat the members of his foundation and to send the bills to the NGO's office for payment.

The NGO expanded his network of sponsors and supporters, and created a website and social media platforms for the foundation, where the stories and testimonials of people helped by the foundation are shared. More people joined this mission, either as volunteers, donors, or spreading the word. New offices were commissioned for the NGO in different localities starting with Ozubulu office which was converted to the headquarters for Nigeria. The foundation has over the years received a lot of positive feedback and recognition for her good work.

He was happy and proud of what he had achieved, but not yet satisfied. He wanted to make healthcare accessible to every

poor person in Nigeria and Africa. He wanted to make the world a better place. He knew that it's a big and difficult goal, but he believes that it's possible. His vision and a passion were accompanied with determination.
